## **HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE DAY**

Shelby Township's annual Household Hazardous Waste Day takes place on Saturday, April 26 at the Shelby Township Municipal Building parking lot from 9:00 AM until 2:00 PM. This is the time to dispose of things such as motor oil, enamel base paint, pesticides, drain cleaners, car batteries, computer components and recently added non-controlled prescription medications. Also accepted are eye glasses, cell phones, hearing aids and fluorescent lights.

## **SPRING FERTILIZING**

Remember, when planning your spring fertilizing, purchase a low or no phosphorus type. This is very important for all homeowners, not just those on the lake, as the quantity of phosphorus affects the water quality in the lake and in the ground water. A bill under discussion presently would make it mandatory to use only low or no phosphorus type fertilizer, so we may as well start now! This new formula is available at most stores that carry fertilizer.

## **STREET DRAINS**

As the weather begins to warm up and the snow melts and the rains begin, if you have a street drain in front of your house, please watch to make sure that it is kept free of leaves and other debris so that the water doesn't build up creating flooding.
